They told us we would need to take advantage of any cafes or pubs we visited but there was a toilet at the end of the pier where you could pee for free. A few of us then made our way along the pier to The Victorian Tea Rooms and a refreshing cup of tea or coffee and not surprisingly met many more of our fellow passengers with the same idea. There are two impressive chandeliers in the tea rooms which seem to lend to them being called "Victorian" and if nothing else it does add to the appearance of age as the pier was first opened to the public in 1872. On leaving the café we continued our walk



to the end of the pier. Walking back and looking towards the pebble beach gave a picturesque view of this seaside town and although the sea looked calm and inviting washing gently up onto the pebbles it did not have many swimmers taking advantage of the sunshine.



Leaving the pier we continued our walk along the promenade and became aware of the danger of the seagulls flying above. A couple from our coach party were sitting at a table by one of the several ice cream kiosks found dotted along the way, enjoying their ice creams, when a seagull swooped down and tried to grab the lolly from the hand that was holding it. You may have seen on the Southern News recently that the colourful gardens along the sea front have been replaced by a drought tolerant type of landscape. They do not
